Please be sure this packet gets to the person who will be coordinating camp registration for your church. This camp is for all youth who are entering 10-12th grades plus those entering their freshmen year in college.

Important Notes about Camp registration:

Deadlines:

Early Registration deadline – postmarked by April 30, 2007 - \$195 per camper, \$75 per adult

Final Registration deadline – postmarked May 1 – May 14, 2007 – \$225 per camper, \$105 per adult

Registrations after May 14, 2007 need the permission of the registrar and are not guaranteed.

Counselors:

- There is important information for Counselors in the Brochure. Please be sure they get a copy.
- Our Conference Safe Sanctuary policy is in effect this year. (Please see Section entitled Safe Sanctuary Information)
- Having counselors by the deadline helps make our camp better and counselors more prepared.
- *Adults must also be Texas Certified through a Training Program over the internet (see below).*
- *EMAILS for adults are extremely important this year!*
- Counselors must attend a Counselor Training Session (In addition to Safe Sanctuary Training).

- Please send counselors ready to serve campers and enjoy a week at camp.
- Encourage counselors to come to Lakeview on Saturday for preparation
- Forms: Please review all forms to be sure they are completely filled out, including signatures.

Safe Sanctuary Information:

All district and conference events must comply with the Texas Annual Conference Safe Sanctuary Policy. The complete policy can be found in the current *Journal* or on the Conference website:

One of the requirements of this policy is that Sr. High Camp will need to have 2 adults in each cabin at Lakeview. Therefore, we are asking you to continue your good work of recruiting the required adults.

- Each church is required to have a 5 to 1 ratio according to gender.
- All adults must be “Safe Sanctuary Certified.” There are two components to this certification:
 1. Each adult must have a criminal background check completed upon them and references submitted and checked. Each local congregation is responsible for completing these checks.
 2. Each adult must attend a Safe Sanctuary training seminar. These will be scheduled in each district. Contact your district office for details on these training seminars, or check the website above. (Note: This is separate from our mandatory Counselor Training sessions). Please make a copy of the Policy from the website for each adult going to camp.
 3. Previously certified adults must have background checks and references checked **each year**, but it is not necessary to attend the Safe Sanctuary seminar again.

State Youth Camp Certification

Effective in June of 2006, the State of Texas requires any adult working with youth to undergo training very similar to our Safe Sanctuary Training. This training **MUST** be done over the internet. Each adult will be emailed a username and password to log on to a website for this training. After the training, they must email a copy of the digital certificate back to the registrar. Training is valid for 2 years, so if they completed it last year, they need not do it again this year.

Dear Senior Pastor,

There are master camp application forms included in this mailing for campers and counselors. Please make copies and have them filled out completely. Make certain that copies include the reverse side (the Standards of Conduct and Early Release Policy). A FAQ about camp a brochure to photocopy and give to parents/youth, and a two color flyers are included as well.

Also included is the check-list necessary for the campers and counselors from your church to be registered. If the items are not completed in their entirety all the forms will be returned with no campers registered. Understand that this may jeopardize any discounts if you have to re-mail your church's forms.

Please include the **“Checklist for Senior Pastors to Complete and Sign”** form with **each** mailing. You may have multiple mailings (for example, you don't want to jeopardize the discount on several campers while to wait to see if one or two more are coming—mail in what you have by the deadline), so please make a copy of this form before using. *Please note we cannot accept any faxes. A fax is not a legal document and therefore can not be used at the hospital.*

Registration for each adult is \$105 this year (\$75 if the early deadline is made). This is still below the actual cost of camp. Because the Conference Safe Sanctuary's requirement for increased adult supervision, we simply cannot subsidize the adults to the extent we have in the past.

Because of the Safe Sanctuary requirements, the conference identified four convicted pedophiles who had applied to be camp counselors the first year we used our policy. Please inform your congregation that their children are safer and the additional cost is well worth the extra care we are taking at camp.

You may view the Safe Sanctuary policy at www.txcumc.org/SafeSanctuaries/SafeHome.htm to be sure all of your adult counselors receive training and become safe sanctuary certified. This effort will require a background check on all adults and three references. It is the responsibility of the church to certify their adults. If this is a problem for your church, please contact your district office.

Call your district this week to get a schedule of Safe Sanctuary Training Seminars.

Counselor Training (this is different than Safe Sanctuary Training) will be held on May 17 in Pearland and Longview at 7pm (specific churches TBA)

May 21 in Lufkin and Houston at 7 pm (specific churches TBA)

At Annual Conference (time and location TBA)

We understand that there may be last minute adult additions or substitutions. The camp can handle a *small* number of adults for training at camp; however, the background check and contacting the three references *must* be done by the church before camp begins. We cannot do that for even 20 adults at camp.

This is the responsibility of the senior pastor (even the ones who delegate it to staff members). For the sake of your youth please be diligent. Your extra effort and full support are greatly appreciated by your Sr. High Conference Registrar...

- One adult counselor is registering for every one to five campers according to gender. Ratio registration form is completed and included.
- Each adult counselor has been Safe Sanctuary trained, and the Certification Checklist has been mailed to Dan Ramsey.
- Each adult counselor is planning to attend Counselor Training on May 17, 21 or at Annual Conference.
- Each adult counselor has had a criminal background check done.
- Social security numbers and birth dates are provided on every form.
- Every camper form is signed by a parent/guardian. Medical forms for each are completed.
- Every form is signed by me, the senior pastor.
- Every adult form is notarized with official notary seal or stamp.
- All counselors meet the proper age requirements (any adults 18-20 are paid staff of the church, and no more than half of these adults are under 21.
- One check, made out to *Sr. High Conference Camp*, is submitted for the total amount owed.

Frequently Asked Questions 2007

Below are some questions that are asked each year. Please read this very carefully. Information marked with a ** needs your special attention.

Q What time does registration start on Monday, and where is it?

Registration is 9:30 to 11:30 AM. *All youth and adults will register in the Central Building first.*

Q I heard camp is only for those who have completed 10th-12th. What happened?

Camp was changed to include those who have completed 9th grade at the suggestions of many youth directors.

Q My church can't make registration by 11:30 AM Monday. What do we do?

Contact the registrar to let him know when you expect to arrive. You may have to check in at the Staff House if you arrive too late. If you have car trouble the day of registration, please call Lakeview.

Q Do counselors and other adults have to come early to camp?

Yes, it is important to be in camp Sunday evening to assist with preparations for camp. Please have as many of your adults who can make it to camp early plan to arrive on Sunday by 6 pm. We will provide supper.

Q What if I can't get all the youth forms mailed before or on the early bird deadline?

Mail the completed forms you have along with a check to cover only those forms you mail. Mail the other forms later with a separate check. You'll have to pay the full registration fee (\$225 for youth and \$105 for adults) for the later ones, but this makes sure you get at least a partial discount. Make sure the parents understand the importance of this deadline.

Q I come from a district that almost always waives camp late fees and/or almost always charges only the early bird deadline fee. How solid are these deadlines?

Very solid. There is a single day's grace so that there are no arguments along the lines of "I mailed it on Monday at 4 pm, but it wasn't postmarked until the next day!" If you mail it ANY time during the day or night on the day of the deadline, you will be fine. The camp is not responsible for postal errors.

Q What if I can't get enough counselors to cover my youth by the deadline?

One counselor is required for each 1 to 5 youth. This means a church will need two counselors for 6-10 youth, 3 counselors for 11-15 youth, etc. Also, all ratios are gender specific. Each 5 male campers require a male counselor, and each five female campers require a female counselor. Registrations may be returned if there are not enough counselors to cover your church's youth. We will choose a properly supervised, smaller camp over a large camp that is inadequately supervised.

****Q Can my church send in a check first, then mail the forms later?**

No. Checks without forms will not hold spots for youth. Checks without forms will also not be used to determine early bird fees.

Q If an adult was Safe Sanctuary Certified last year, is that person automatically certified for this year?

No. Although they don't need to go through the training again, they will still need to send a new background check release form and a new set of references (it can be the same people as last year) to Dan Ramsey. This is necessary every 12 months to remain certified. Counselor training is separate from Safe Sanctuary Training and needs to be done each year as well. The dates and cities of the Counselor training can be found in this packet.

Q If an adult was certified by the State of Texas last year, is that person certified for this year?

Yes. Certification by the State of Texas lasts two years. They must also be Safe Sanctuary Certified.

Q I've had a member join our church last month. He said he's certified. Is there a list I can check?

Yes. You can go to www.txcumc.org to check a list. This list is not always 100% up to date, but it will usually answer your question. You can also call Dan Ramsey and ask. His number is found elsewhere in this packet.

Q My church is very small and mostly elderly. I have one youth that wants to come, but can't find a counselor. What do I do?

Pastors make great counselors. In some cases, small churches pool adults so that there is still a 5 to 1 ratio. You may "pair up" with another church if you can't find counselors in your own church. For example, church X is taking 7 girls and has two female counselors. Church Y has two female youth but no female counselors. However, together, they have a good enough ratio: 2 adults to 9 girls. Please make a note for the registrar if you have "paired" with another church for this purpose.

Q I had some youth cancel. Can I get a refund?

The last day to request a refund is June 1, 2007. This is a full refund, but a very firm deadline. Of course, a camper may replace another camper who cannot come. Just call the registrar and let him know.

Q Why is there a refund deadline?

The directors have materials to purchase well in advance of camp; they need to finalize their own programming budgets, and in many cases have already committed the money. Please publicize this deadline in your church.

****Q What is the cut-off date for a person to turn the proper age and still come to camp as a counselor?**

Counselors must be 21 years old by the day camp starts (June 11th). We will allow adults under 21 ONLY if they are serving your church as paid staff. These younger adults are called assistant counselors and will be paired with counselors ages 21 or older. In addition to being paid staff, they must be 18 (and have a high school diploma) by June 11. Assistant counselors count as "adults" for ratio purposes, but no more than half your counselors may be under 21.

Q I think I have provided all the information I'm supposed to, but am scared to death I've missed something. I don't want my forms returned. Under what circumstances will you return the all the registrations?

Included with this FAQ is a letter to the senior pastor with an extensive checklist. That checklist should be included with your mailing. There are several items that must be reviewed carefully and checked off before mailing your forms. The letter is easy to understand and fill out. If you follow the list, you will be fine. If your pastor does not fill this form out, there is an increased risk of having all registration forms returned to your church.

Q What is the absolute last day to register?

Anyone wanting to register after May 14th must have the permission of the registrar and camp coordinator. Substitutions of same gender in the same age-level camp can always be accepted, although you still need to contact the camp registrar as soon as you know the information.

Q What is the Medical Information Form?

It is a form to help the nurse be able to organize the medications for the youth. Each youth that takes any medications should have this form filled out and have the prescriptions in the original containers.

Q Can you accept faxed or copied forms, or must you have the originals?

The forms received by the registrar must have the original signatures on them. This is a legal issue for Lakeview and relates specifically to emergency health care. Other information (except signatures) can be copied. Forms without original signatures will not be registered. Faxes cannot be accepted because it is not an original signature.

****Q I have parents who are concerned about submitting the youth's Social Security number. Is this necessary?**

Yes and No. If a Social Security number is not submitted, the family will not be able to use Lakeview's insurance policies to cover the cost of any hospital or doctor visits that may occur due to sickness or injury. Please make sure that the parents understand that if they do not submit a SS# that they are assuming full financial responsibility for any medical emergencies that may happen at camp. Please write a note to that affect on the form or with the form so that we know that the missing SS# was not an oversight, but an intentional decision on the part of the parent.

Q Someone said this was a leadership camp or a camp to make preachers. Is that what is going to happen at camp?

The theme this year for Sr. High camp is the same for all the other camps--Passionate Worship. That is the focus of the camp. We will have opportunities for any youth who feel called to full-time service in the church explore that in settings that are specific for that purpose. We do not, however, plan to sit down all the youth and try to get them to be preachers. We do plan to create an opportunity for anyone whom God is already calling to the church to explore and share that call. This, however, is **not** the focus of camp. It is a single part of the curriculum that should be offered at any Christian youth camp and every church. In addition, the focus is not for this to be a "leadership" camp--unless you mean that we plan to help grow them in their faith, train them as disciples, encourage them to accept the roles and responsibilities that God has called them to (whatever those roles may be), and give them tools to live a faithful life pleasing to God. Hopefully, we are all trying to do that each time we meet with the youth, and if we succeed in these things, they will certainly become better leaders in our churches.

Registering the Day of Camp

Sr. High Conference Camp

The following information should be given to anyone who will be taking youth to camp on Monday morning from 9:30 am to 11:30 am to register. Please read this carefully.

1. ALL youth and adults will register at the Central Building (in the same building the Lakeview offices are located) before going to their individual camps. Enclosed is a map of Lakeview that shows where the Central Building is located. There will be signs to follow at camp as well.
2. ONE adult per group will register the entire church. To avoid confusion and traffic congestion, we are asking that everyone else remain in their vehicles during registration.
3. A list of adults and youth that are registered will be mailed to the church in advance. (An email of this list can be sent upon request to tom@sfawesley.org). Bringing this with you will expedite registration, especially if you make any changes on your list before you arrive.
4. The driver of the vehicle should remain at the Central Building until the church is registered. Do not take the youth to their individual camps until the church is registered.
5. When the church is registered, a printout detailing the youth and adults in each camp will be given to the adult. The adult may then take them to their individual camps.
6. Except to register your youth, please do not park in the Central Building parking area until registration is over. The parking lot should be open after 2 PM Monday.
7. Youth Camp is over after the noon meal on Friday. Please do not plan to pick up your youth until after the meal. Please feel free to join your youth for the noon meal. The cost is \$6.50 for anyone who did not attend camp. There is not a central check-out area. Go directly to your child's age-level camp to pick him or her up. You may be required to show photo identification.

**Lakeview Methodist Conference Center
Standards Regarding Disorderly Conduct**

Adopted 2-22-91 ~ Revised 11-17-2006

The general purposes of this code are to establish a system of prohibitions and correctional measures to deal with conduct that unjustifiably and inexcusably causes harm or threatens harm to those public interests which the Lakeview Methodist Conference Center, its Board of Directors, Administrator, and Employee Staff are obligated to protect. To this end the provisions of this code are intended, and shall be construed, to achieve the above objective.

If a person commits an act under the following mental states: intentional, knowing, reckless, or with negligence, that person is responsible for his or her own conduct and for the conduct of others for whom he/she is responsible.

The following offenses are included in this category:

1. Criminal mischief, reckless damage or destruction to property, structures, equipment, or vehicles, and theft (under \$750.00).
2. Disorderly conduct or breach of the peace such as use of abusive, indecent, profane, or vulgar language or gestures; indecent exposure or public lewdness; or displays that tend to incite a breach of the peace; or creating by chemical or other means a noxious and unreasonable odor in a public place.
3. Possession or use of alcoholic beverages or controlled substances.
4. Possession of firearms, fireworks, illegal or prohibited knives, knuckles, clubs or instruments of any type that are specially designed, made, or adapted for the purpose of inflicting bodily injury.
5. Injury, reckless conduct, or terroristic threat that would indicate intent to do bodily harm to self or others.
6. Enticement or solicitation of a child.
7. Sexual harassment, either verbal or physical.
- 7.5. Violation of the Safe Sanctuary Policy.
8. Other conduct that interrupts, disrupts, impedes, or otherwise interferes with a planned program.
9. The use of fire starter devices or pyrotechnics are prohibited unless used in organized programs which have been approved by Lakeview. In no case will open fires be allowed in or near structures or unprotected areas.
10. Cutting, breaking, or otherwise defacing trees, shrubs, or other native plants is prohibited unless part of a program of improvement approved by Lakeview.

Code of Procedure For Disorderly Conduct

Acting within the authority provided by its By-Laws, the Lakeview Methodist Conference Center establishes the following measures for violations of this code:

- I. Felony violations of the laws of this state, along with lesser offenses where the offender causes bodily injury to a person or destruction of property, will be reported to the law enforcement agency having jurisdiction of this area.
- II. Misdemeanor offenses or violations of Lakeview's General Policies may be reported to local law enforcement agencies. Correctional measures shall be imposed by Lakeview's Administrator (or in the administrator's absence, the Lakeview staff person in charge), the camp coordinator, and the director of the offender's group. These measures may in some cases require that the offender leave Lakeview Methodist Conference Center.
- III. The parents of a Camper shall be notified immediately by the Camper's Director and/or Coordinator in the presence of Lakeview's Administrator when any offense against or by a Camper is determined.

THIS CODE WILL APPLY EQUALLY TO REGISTERED CAMPERS, GUESTS, VISITORS, STAFF, and EMPLOYEES.
